



## ICIAM Prize Rules

International Council for Industrial and Applied Mathematics (ICIAM)

(as at 13 October 2000)

- §1. ICIAM **President** is the chair of the ICIAM Prize Committee (in the following ‘PC’).
- §2. The chair of each subcommittee (in the following ‘subC’) is a member of **PC**, but **PC** may include additional members.
- §3.
  - The membership of **PC** is public information.
  - The members of **PC** should be members of an ICIAM member society.
  - **subC** for each specific prize should be appointed at least 3 years prior to ICIAM meeting.
  - Members of **subCs** need not be members of ICIAM **member societies**. The membership (other than the chair) of **subCs** is secret until the prize has been announced.
- §4. Prize specifications should be provided to **subC**. Specifications should be specific. Each **subC** should be informed of all other prize specifications.
- §5.
  - Each **subC** should generate an announcement calling for nominations in consultation with ICIAM President, and have it published in member society newsletters 2 to 2½ years in advance. Same text should be used in all announcements, although may be translated. This announcement should require nominations to be received at least 18 months prior to the award (or earlier if a talk at the next ICIAM will be required) and to be submitted to the **PC** chair (i.e. President, not to **subC**). Nominations should be accompanied by information and letters.
  - Each subC may generate its own nominations.
  - No nomination for a member or very close associate of a member of the **subC** can be accepted. To this end, all associations between members of the **subCs** and nominees should be disclosed by the members.
- §6. The **subC** should generate an ordered list of about 3 names.  
The **PC** makes the final selection.
- §7. If a talk is to be given at ICIAM the selection should be made at least 18 months prior to the award.  
The chair of the **International Program Committee** (IPC) of the next ICIAM should be informed at time of selection, but information should otherwise remain confidential until the announcement at the next ICIAM conference.
- §8. In special cases, the **PC** may make the award to a person who cannot attend the ICIAM at which the prize is announced.  
ICIAM **President** should notify awardee and determine whether he/she will accept prize and be present at meeting.
- §9. There is no requirement that the awardee hold membership in any member society of ICIAM or any other society — although if there were prize(s) doing service to the applied mathematics community, it is unlikely that non-members would be chosen.

- §10. The award is presented by ICIAM [President](#).
- §11. The amount of the prize is not fixed, but changes according to the funds available. It is the intent that the size of the prize is of the order of USD 1000 in 1994, plus an amount that could cover the costs of travel to the meeting. The amount will be determined prior to the announcement of each prize.
